MacRostie Art Center is a nonprofit arts organization that has been a part of the Grand Rapids community since the 1960s. Located in a historic building in downtown Grand Rapids, the MAC is a regional art center, working to make our community strong and vibrant by providing all people the opportunity, access, tools, and inspiration to realize their creative potential.

The MAC hosts over 20 exhibitions each year, both in its downtown location and in satellite galleries throughout the area. MAC's studios offer a variety of classes to help people from all levels of experience learn new techniques and to provide a space to create and connect through coursework led by talented local artists. The art shop at MacRostie Art Center features work from over 100 local artists, creating opportunities for artists to have their work seen and purchased.

The Giinawind Creative Space is the MAC's newest program. In the Ojibwe language, Giinawind is an inclusive pronoun that means "we/us together", and the space is intended as place to highlight Indigenous artists and encourage community gatherings.
